



Mendoza & ICLA Facilities

Mendoza, Argentina's fourth largest city, was founded in 1561 by the Spanish and was previously populated by the indigenous Huarpes, Incas, and Puelches.

Today Mendoza is a city with a strong history of European immigration, as most Mendocinos are of Italian, Jewish European, Syrian, Lebanese and Spanish decedent. ICLA is located in the traditional city neighborhood of Sexta.

Excellent ice cream shops, pastry shops, cafes, small gift stores, and two city parks are within short walking distances. A quick trolley or taxi ride, 10-15 minutes, brings you to Mendoza's downtown and social districts as well as the famous General San Martín Park.

The institute has three classrooms, including a library, study areas, and two patios with views of the Andes. Students may check their email and work on language exercises with school computers or connect to ICLA's wireless network.

Our bilingual library is stocked with fiction and non fiction books, movies, and games in Spanish.

Your Home Stay

Homestay families are hand picked and offer students an excellent opportunity to practice their Spanish while experiencing day to day Argentine living. Families provide breakfast, dinner, and single rooms with regularly freshened linens.

Students can call home regularly with the use of a calling card, like the one you will receive in your ICLA welcome pack.
