Situated in the heart of the Mediterranean, Malta possesses a typical island culture. Yet, this has not led to isolation, on the contrary. As a consequence of its location at the crossroads of maritime routes between Europe, Africa and Asia, Malta has always been strategically important. Many different cultures have set foot on the islands, leaving their imprints, which are still visible today. These foreign influences are for instance present in the Maltese language; an interesting fusion of Arabic and other romance languages. At the same time, Malta has a perfectly English-speaking population. This enhances accessibility for foreign researchers and acts a perfect entry point for anthropologists. Plenty of possibilities for interesting field research are available: from architectural and religious sites to tourism and ethnic relations.
